. OVERVIEW

This Partnership Policy outlines the institutional collaboration framework, operational procedures, quality standards, governance principles, and partnership expectations established by EduIntl (Educational International Limited).

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all institutional collaborations are developed transparently, ethically, professionally, and in alignment with international educational standards. EduIntl is committed to building strong global partnerships that promote academic excellence, international cooperation, student development, professional training, research collaboration, and institutional growth.

This policy applies to all partner institutions, universities, colleges, training providers, consultants, research organizations, and international education stakeholders collaborating with EduIntl.

1. Partnership Objectives

The primary objectives of EduIntl partnerships include:

 - ▶ Developing joint educational and professional programmes

 - ▶ Encouraging cross-cultural engagement and international networking

2. Partnership Eligibility

Institutions seeking collaboration with EduIntl must meet the following requirements:

- ▶ Be legally registered and recognised within their country
 - ▶ Operate in compliance with national educational regulations
 - ▶ Maintain ethical and professional academic standards
 - ▶ Demonstrate commitment to educational quality assurance
 - ▶ Provide accurate institutional information and documentation
 - ▶ Agree to comply with EduIntl operational policies and partnership guidelines

EduIntl reserves the right to request additional verification documents where necessary.

3. Institutional Verification

All institutions undergo a rigorous verification and due diligence process before partnership approval. Verification may include:

- ▶ Registration certificate validation
- ▶ Accreditation and licensing review
- ▶ Institutional website and profile review
- ▶ Academic programme evaluation
- ▶ Compliance and governance checks
- ▶ Identity verification of authorised representatives

EduIntl may reject applications that fail verification requirements or provide misleading information.

4. International Collaboration Standards

EduIntl partnerships are developed based on internationally accepted standards of cooperation, professionalism, inclusivity, and academic integrity. Partner institutions are expected to:

- ▶ Participate actively in collaborative initiatives

5. Quality Assurance

EduIntl prioritises educational quality and institutional credibility in all collaborative activities. Quality assurance measures may include:

- ▶ Programme monitoring and evaluation
- ▶ Student feedback and performance reviews
- ▶ Institutional performance assessments
- ▶ Regular communication and reporting

Institutions failing to maintain acceptable quality standards may face suspension or termination of partnership agreements.



6. Compliance & Governance

- ▶ Ethical business and academic practices

EduIntl maintains zero tolerance toward fraudulent activity, misrepresentation, unethical recruitment, document falsification, or misconduct of any kind.

7. Student Protection Policies

Partner institutions must prioritise student welfare, safety, and support services. Institutions are expected to:

- ▶ Provide accurate programme information
- ▶ Maintain transparent fee structures
- ▶ Offer appropriate student support services
- ▶ Protect student data and privacy
- ▶ Ensure non-discriminatory treatment
- ▶ Support academic and personal wellbeing

Any complaints involving student exploitation, discrimination, or unethical treatment may result in partnership review or immediate termination.

8. Ethical Partnership Practices

EduIntl is committed to maintaining ethical and responsible partnerships. All partners must:

- ▶ Operate honestly and transparently
- ▶ Avoid misleading marketing practices
- ▶ Respect intellectual property rights
- ▶ Maintain confidentiality where required
- ▶ Avoid conflicts of interest
- ▶ Engage professionally in all communications

Unethical conduct may result in immediate suspension of all collaborative activities.

9. Programme Coordination Procedures

Collaborative programmes may include:

- ▶ Student exchange programmes
- ▶ Faculty exchange initiatives
- ▶ Joint certifications and diplomas
- ▶ Professional development courses

- ▶ Research collaborations
 - ▶ International conferences and workshops
 - ▶ Consultancy and training programmes

Programme implementation procedures may involve proposal submission, institutional review, MoU approval, programme planning, monitoring, and periodic evaluation.

10. Partnership Approval Process

The standard partnership approval process includes the following stages:

- ▶ Submission of formal partnership request
- ▶ Institutional review and verification
- ▶ Initial consultation and discussions
- ▶ Documentation assessment
- ▶ Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) preparation and approval
- ▶ Official onboarding and activation

- ▶ Non-compliance with legal obligations
- ▶ Reputational risks to EduIntl or its stakeholders
- ▶ Failure to maintain acceptable quality standards

Termination procedures will include formal notification and a review process where appropriate.

13. Policy Amendments



EduIntl may update or revise this policy periodically to reflect operational, legal, regulatory, or strategic developments.

Partner institutions are encouraged to review partnership policies regularly to remain informed of current compliance requirements and obligations.
